Welcome to the University of Oxford

For more than 800 years colleges and halls have existed around the city of Oxford. They began as medieval halls of residence for students under the supervision of a Master. The oldest colleges, University, Balliol and Merton, were founded in the late 13th century. Parks College is the newest and will start welcoming postgraduate students in the 2021–22 academic year. Today, the 39 colleges and six permanent private halls are related to the University through a federal system.

Colleges and halls are communities in which students live and study. They are the main focus of their everyday lives. The college is responsible for students' academic progress through the tutorial system, and for their welfare. Each has its own sports facilities and teams. In addition, there is the opportunity to join University teams and compete with other universities at events.

At any college students will be studying different subjects alongside each other, such as law, medicine and maths. Each college offers most of the subjects taught at the University.


All colleges accept male and female students, and they all accept applications from mature students, while Harris Manchester College is solely for mature students. Campion Hall, Green Templeton, Kellogg, Linacre, Nuffield, St Antony's, St Cross and Wolfson Colleges admit only postgraduate students. All Souls is unique among Oxford colleges because it has no student members: all are Fellows (except the Warden).


