

## Dear St Crossers,

As the College is celebrating its 60 <sup>th</sup> Anniversary, I am vividly reminded of my experience at St Cross, where I found a home away from home, a place where I would learn and also form true and lasting friendships.



Last spring, I was able to visit Oxford again for the first time in many years. To my surprise and joy, I found that so much has changed — yet the College feels the same. It has retained familiar enthusiasm and excitement, its sense of community. The St Cross spirit is international, welcoming, and comforting. It allows you to connect with people from all over the world. I treasure the kindness, curiosity, and collaboration that have been defining traits of our College from its earliest days.

60 years is a long time for a person, but St Cross is a very young College when compared to others within the University of Oxford. The meaning of that is two-fold: on the one hand, St Cross does not have funds acquired over the course of centuries. On the other hand, we as St Crossers have an incredible opportunity to influence the present and future of our alma mater.

This anniversary year is a special time to give. As you will have read in previous e-mails, the College is being supported by a generous donor who will match every new donation received by St Cross during the current academic year. All single gifts will be doubled in value, while for new regular (monthly, quarterly, annual) gifts, the full value of the first year of the donation will be tripled. That means if you donate \$100, the College will receive \$200 in total. If you donate \$100 per year, the College will receive \$300.

the matching donor's support will build up a new Community Bursary. Those Bursaries reward students' community involvement, leadership and entrepreneurship, and the awardees have done some fantastic work.

My own journey as a St Cross donor is part of my experience of being a St Crosser. Back when I was a student at the College, I received a grant that allowed me to travel to London

being matched and so going further, even a modest donation will make a difference.



## **Graduate Scholarships**



This year, St Cross is home to 689 students from 73 countries, reading 208 different degrees. This diversity is integral to the College ethos and reflects our founding mission: to expand academic opportunity.


Students today face substantial financial
