

Using St Cross College Library

The library is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and accessed with your fob. As a reader you are entitled to borrow up to twelve items at a time for a period of four weeks and unreserved books can be renewed up to three times.

To borrow books please either use <u>click and collect</u> or our <u>self-issue terminal</u>. Returned books can be deposited in the returns cupboards in the college entrance or library. We have monitors, laptop stands, fleeces and book rests for your use.

To recommend a book (either print or eResource) for the library please email us on <u>librarian@stx.ox.ac.uk</u> There are <u>printing facilities</u> in the library and Wi-Fi access via <u>Eduroam</u>.

You also have the option to study in the Catherine and Douglas Wigdor Room opposite the library, here you can bring in food and drink and discuss your research with your fellow students. This room is home to the <u>James Currey Collection</u>, a unique resource on African politics, history and literature. This collection is reference only, so please <u>contact us</u> if you wish to consult it.

In the Lange Room you will find our book exchange and comfortable reading chairs, the books in here can be borrowed and returned at your discretion and you are welcome to leave books you no longer need.

Across the quad you will find <u>Pusey House Library</u>, predominantly a theology library it welcomes visitors from all disciplines, and you can join its <u>Scriptorium</u> during term time.
